A Message from our 2nd Street Librarian....

Over the holidays we encourage you to take time to continue to read with your children. Reading aloud with children is an important activity for parents and caregivers. It helps children learn to read and to become better readers. Even older children enjoy hearing a story read aloud.

It may be a favourite story in your home or a book borrowed from the school or public library. Let your child choose a story that you can read to them or a story you can read to each other.

Children who can read independently will improve their reading skills and vocabulary by selecting a variety of books including different types of stories (for example: adventure, mysteries, humour, historical, realistic, etc.) and nonfiction (for example: biographies, folktales, science, technology, sports, art, etc.)

The closest branch of the Burnaby Public Library is the Tommy Douglas Library at 7311 Kingsway. On weekdays the regular hours are from 10 am to 9 pm. Loan periods for books borrowed from the public library are usually four weeks.

- 2. **Read ANYTHING!** A book, blog, magazine or letter from grandma. Read together and get in your 20 minutes each day.
- 3. Be a Rockstar: Sing along with the radio or do Karaoke- maybe a duet?
- 4. Make something yummy: Follow a family recipe or create a new one together.
- 5. Travel the world: Your library card is your passport to travel the world and to take a learning journey.
