WEATHER RELATED SCHOOL CLOSURES

All schools will remain **OPEN**, unless there is heavy snowfall, damage or other circumstances (e.g. power outage) that make it impossible to operate safely. In the event there are certain schools or the entire district closed due to snow (or any other weather-related issues), announcements will be made on local radio stations by 7 a.m. on the day of the closure. Please **do not** call the radio station – tune in and listen for the announcements, or check the radio station websites.

Closure information will also be posted on the district website at www.burnabyschools.ca and on Twitter @burnabyschools (please follow us!). However, keep in mind that there may be situations where this is not possible, for example, if there are power outages or technical problems. The most reliable way to get school closure information is to listen to the local radio stations.

PLEASE NOTE: Information will <u>only</u> be provided on school closures. If there is <u>no</u> closure information, our schools are open for learning! However, the decision to send your child to school, or not, is ultimately a family decision.

GRADE 7 PARENTS

COLDER WEATHER

With the colder weather upon us, please try to make sure your child(ren) are dressed appropriately for the weather. Students are expected to be outside during recess and the lunch hour - this includes light rain conditions. Long sleeves, hats, gloves, and warm jackets would be best.



Hot Lunch Envelopes

Our hot lunch program is a valuable resource for all of our families. We will ensure that no child goes without a



lunch, but we are running into difficulties with ordering because many of our students are not returning their hot lunch envelopes. The amount of food ordered is in relation to the number of envelopes returned. Please ensure that envelopes are returned promptly with whatever payment you are able to make. Students without envelopes will be the last students served in order to ensure there is enough food for those who have returned the envelope.

Are your Child's Immunizations Up to Date for Kindergarten?

Vaccines are a healthy choice for your child. They provide immunity and prevent disease. Two vaccines are free for Kindergarten age children starting at age 4:

- Tdap-IPV: protects against tetanus diphtheria, pertussis (whooping cough) and polio
- MMRV: protects against measles, mumps, rubella and varicella (chickenpox)

If public health does not have up to date information about your child's immunizations, you will get a letter from your local public health unit. If you get a letter from public health, please provide a copy of your child's immunization record as soon as possible. You can:

- Take the record to your local public health unit
- Email the record to reportimmunizations@fraserhealth.ca, you can do this by emailing a photo or typing your child's record; be sure the record includes your child's full name, date of birth, sex, and personal health number (if available)
- Fax or mail the record to your local public health unit

If your child needs additional immunizations, please call your family doctor, local pharmacist (for those 5 years of age and older), or public health to book an appointment.

COVID-19 and Youth Mental Health

Since COVID-19 was declared a pandemic, many public health responses have been implemented including social distancing measures and school closures.

These measures may have an impact on the mental health of children and teens, and we need to adjust the type and amount of resources being offered our children.

The MyHEARTSMAP team needs your help to measure how much and in what ways the changes in our lives during the pandemic have affected the social and psychological wellness of our children and youth.

Using the MyHEARTSMAP online psychosocial self-screening tool, children, youth, and (or) their parents, can learn about which aspects of their mental health may be of concern and might benefit from support resources, and where to find them in BC.

Learning about our children's needs will help guide our provincial mental health resource planning.
