At this time of year, families begin thinking about their child's class placement for the upcoming school year. Please know that our staff members work together to thoughtfully place students in classes based on the number of teachers assigned to our school by the District Staffing Team. When determining each student's placement, a variety of factors are considered. For example: academic and social strengths and needs, learning styles, friendships, a balance of boys and girls, along with the number of students in each class, special interests, and available support staff. We use our professional judgment and existing data (while engaging in careful discussion) as we create classes, keeping in mind the considerations listed above. It is the responsibility of the school staff to arrange classes so that each student has a positive learning environment and teachers have a manageable teaching assignment.

If you wish to share information about your student, **written** requests for class placement that describe the academic, social and/or physical needs of your student will be considered. **Please do not request specific teachers.** Letters must be submitted to the office by Friday, June 4.

Please note that these letters are shared with our teaching staff when classes are created. As always, classes will be finalized in September. If you have any questions, please feel free to call me (604-296-9029).

## **REMINDERS FROM THE SCHOOL OFFICE**

1. **Changes to child's information:** If your child's information changes - address, phone number (home, cell, or work), email address, or emergency contact information - please let the school office know. ***It is critical that we have current student information in the event of an emergency.***
  - If a phone number or email address has changed — send the office a note with the updated information.
  - If your address has changed — we must update the proof of residency documents in your child's student file. The school district requires us to have two items on file — **at least one** being from Category A below:
    - Category A: proof of ownership of dwelling or long-term lease or rental of dwelling; legal documents indicating BC residence; parent or guardian filing income tax returns as a BC resident
    - Category B: BC hydro bill, BC cable bill, Provincial driver's license, provincial registration of automobile, Canadian bank accounts or credit cards
2. **Student absences or tardiness:** If your child will be absent from school because of an illness, a medical appointment, vacation, etc., please call the school office (even if you have told their teacher) **before 9:00 a.m. and leave a message [604.296.2909 and press 2 for our absentee line]** with your child's name, their teacher's name, and the reason for their absence. If your child arrives late, please remind them to come to the office for a late slip **BEFORE they go to class.**
3. **Registration for 2021/2022 School Year**
  - **Grade 7 Parents:** Current Grade 7 students (living in Burnaby) are automatically registered at their catchment secondary school for Grade 8 (starting in September 2021). **Students who do not live in the catchment area of the Secondary School they wish to attend, MUST submit a Cross-District or Out-of-District Transfer Application to their school of choice.** If you have any questions please call the office at 604.296.9029 ext. 3.
  - **Registration:** Students entering Kindergarten in September 2021 must register online at their English catchment school. For more information about *Registration Requirements*, please go to the Burnaby School District's website <https://burnabyschools.ca/registration/>
  - \* **Cross District Application or Out-of-District Application:** if you would like your child to attend Second Street but live outside our catchment area, please register online at your catchment school and then complete and send a Cross-District or Out-of-District Application form to Second Street School. Please go the Burnaby School District's website to find the forms: <https://burnabyschools.ca/registration-categories/#studenttransfers>
  - \* **Mandarin Immersion and French Immersion:** If you live in Burnaby and want to apply to either the French Immersion or Mandarin Immersion program, you must first register your child at their English catchment school. Applications for the Immersion programs may be completed online during the month of February. # HOW TO WEAR A CLOTH FACE MASK



## PUTTING ON YOUR MASK



- 1 Wash or sanitize your hands before touching your mask
- 2 Put the loops around your ears
- 3 Cover your mouth and nose so there are no gaps, fitting the mask under your chin

## REMOVING YOUR MASK



- 1 Wash or sanitize your hands
- 2 Do not touch the front of your mask, lean forward and gently remove it by the loops
- 3 Wash or sanitize your hands

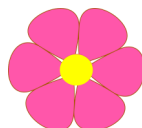
## MASKS IN BURNABY SCHOOLS

The Ministry of Education has advised school districts that all K-12 staff and all students in Grades 4-12 are required to wear a mask while indoors at school, including when they are at their desks or workstations. Kindergarten to Grade 3 students are strongly encouraged to do so, as well. 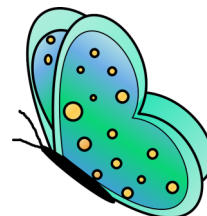

## Key Policies

**BALL/SHIRT:** Campers will only receive 1 camp soccer ball & 1 tshirt. If a camper attends 5 or more weeks of camp, he/she will receive a 2nd ball & tshirt on his/her 5th week of camp.

**INCLEMENT WEATHER:** While camp will continue at designated shelter or indoor facility until inclement weather clears, soccer and active games will likely not be played indoors. There are no refunds due to bad weather.

**LATE PICKUP:** Pick up beyond 5:00 pm (for full day sessions) will be charged at \$10 per 15 minutes. We reserve the right to ask you to withdraw from camp for multiple late pick ups past 5:00pm.

**TRANSPORTATION not provided:** We do not offer pick up or drop off service, however, if camp must travel offsite for any reason, we will arrange bussing and your onsite Supervisor will notify you.

## Camp Sessions

At Royal Soccer Club, we're much more than just a soccer camp. We have 2 different sessions you can register for. Campers will build confidence and creativity as we foster an inclusive, engaging and active summer camp experience. We recognize that many of our campers attend for multiple weeks of camp, so we accommodate this by introducing weekly themes and vary the activities & skill exercises. We aim to provide the best experience for your child.

### Morning Sessions 9 am - 12 noon

Morning sessions are geared towards campers who just want a half day program and prefer the soccer focus. Programming consists of learning and playing soccer daily which includes a daily warm up, individual skill development, fun team games, soccer scrimmages and mini-Royal Cups. Campers are grouped by age, size (& ability where possible) in groups sizes are about 10 campers to 1 staff (these ratios are subject to change).

**Drop off:** 8:30 - 9:00 am **Pick up:** 12 - 12:30 pm (no charge)  
**Extended before care:** 8 - 8:30 am (\$15/camper/week)  
**Extended after care:** 12:30 - 1 pm (\$15/camper/week)  
**Before & after care:** 8 - 8:30am, 12:30 - 1pm (\$20/camper/week)



### Full Day Sessions 9 am - 4 pm

Our full days sessions are the most popular sessions families register for. These sessions combine the morning sessions (as outlined above) with a fun afternoon session (that may or may not include a leisure swim depending upon the option you select during registration). All campers will play a variety of camp games in the afternoon. Campers who choose the swim option will also get a chance to swim at the nearby pool each afternoon (some locations may not swim every day). The afternoon swim portion is fully supervised by our camp staff and professional pool facility lifeguards. There are limited spaces for the 'swim' option to ensure supervision ratios are safe and pool regulations met. At some locations, campers aged 5 to 7 may not be able to choose the 'swim' option due to pool restrictions. If you have any swim concerns, speak to your onsite Supervisor or contact us at 1-800-427-0536. There might not be any soccer played in the afternoon sessions.
