- Math Buddies! here Mondays after school, bit of a waitlist for our kids. Currently 25 kids in program (between grades 4-7), matched with Big Buddies (Cariboo Math Students)
- Mentorship (at both schools) 50 pairs = 100 kids. Our students individually, intentionally matched with a Cariboo student. Fridays 8:50 9:30.
- This Friday is **popcorn day**. Ms. Farina's class is advertising and promoting each morning.
- **4.6. Thank you's!** Santa Breakfast, schoolwide breakfast and for the hamper campaign. So many contributors, volunteers and helpers. Big success and lots of fun! I will be writing letters to all orgs/folks who contributed funds/gifts/food.

4.7. In the works (what else is filling my professional plate?):

- Next week there is a **Healthy Kids Preschool Fair** (HKPF) meeting. We will see if we will/should get it going again at Edmonds community centre. It is for children 0-5 with parents all resources/services/Fraser Health in this area come and give demos, free info. Hopefully it happens again! I am in charge of the volunteers who are grade 7's, from both schools.
- 2 after school programs at Cariboo promoting and registering
- Association for Community Education of BC (ACEbc) I am President of that provincial professional
 organization. We are currently planning a provincial coordinator for Spring, and provincial meetings
 are ongoing.
- Supporting Burnaby Youth Society **(SBYS)** I am Chair of that org and we meet and fund requests around district to help with program costs for kids and schools, such as camps and bringing speakers in, etc. In a restructuring phase to see if we can continue operating at this time.
- Food Hub continues every Tues. morning at Edmonds. Three other coordinators and I supervise/organize this. About 1/3 families pick up from Edmonds, the rest get food delivered. Each week. Many volunteers working their and delivering. I am in charge of volunteers and drivers. About 90 families on the list. Many newcomers to Canada. Every school that has some families on the list has some representation volunteering. Building connections, work experience, and community

5. Principal Update (Jeff)

- 5.1. **School Sports** programs are starting up again:
 - Boys Basketball had 18 people at first meeting!
 - Girl's Basketball as a parent volunteer leading the team, with four teacher supporting
- 5.2. Gr 7 going to **camp** for first time in 4 years
- 5.3. **Field trips** beginning again, with lots of engagement from teachers and students. Gr 5-6 classes are planning a trip to Victoria, including a Legislature tour. Other classes have gone to the Britannia Mines. Thank you to the Council for the additional funds this year.
- 5.4. **English Language Learners Teacher** vacancy. This is a very specialized position and the school has been struggling to fill the role. It has been reposted this month and Jeff is hopeful it will be filled soon.
- 5.5. **Farewell:** This is Jeff's last week at the school, after 5.5 years as Principal. He is going to Chaffey-Burke elementary school. Our new principal is Christy Redmond, currently at Lochdale elementary. Ms Redmond has community school background.
- 6. Update on Fundraising (Stefanie)
