A Whole-Child Approach

On our last Professional Day, the staff spent part of the day talking about a whole-child approach to education. The ACSD's (Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development) and Whole-Child Action Plan Guide explains:

"A school committed to the whole child, not only in words but in actions, is one where the cognitive, physical, social, and <u>emotional needs</u> of students are intentionally addressed throughout classroom curriculum, instruction, and assessment, staff development, school culture, and family and community engagement. ... Like every student, every school has unique histories, resources, interests, and needs that an effective whole child approach will reflect."

We looked at the 5, research-backed areas, that the ASCD says children need in order to thrive. Children need to be:

Healthy Engaged Safe Challenged Supported

In fact, we **ALL** need to feel these things, in order to thrive.

What do your children need to feel healthy, safe, engaged, challenged and supported?

What do YOU need to feel these things?

A Community School embraces this approach, as it focusses on the whole child, which means we understand that children are part of many communities: their family, their friends, their culture, their traditions, their neighbourhood, and more. That means each child is unique, and each needs different things in order to thrive.

Community Schools put the child in the centre, and they continually try to create ways to enhance social and emotional development, health and wellbeing, lifelong learning, and community development. Here is a diagram that illustrates the Community School Approach in BC:



A Community School has extra opportunities, extra relationships and extra hours; this means that meeting the needs of diverse learners and their families, is even more possible.

- What you can do to encourage kindness in early childhood
- Model Behaviour you want to see.
- Create opportunities for kindness.
- Practice kind conversations.
- Give praise for good behaviour.
- Respond calmly if your child is unkind.
- Create clear family rules around kindness.

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In addition to volunteering, the following are on-going ways to contribute to our school.


- **Refundable Containers** Drop off empty containers at an Express Return-It Depot and credit the school using: **604-296-9029**
