A Note from the Community Office

We can change the way we have been responding to life and our everyday issues and conflicts. We can learn Nonviolent Communication (NVC) which is kind of a language of care and compassion and a tool for creating and maintaining calm and peace in our homes, and in our communities. NVC is based on the idea that our actions and behaviours come from us trying to get our needs met. When we ignore our needs, or try to forget them or hide them, they grow bigger.

At our CommuniTEA Time last week, we had a powerful conversation led by NVC facilitator (and Second Street parent) Sahar Sanai. Sahar led us through some of the main concepts of NVC and we learned about the metaphors of the Jackal, and the more connected and positive, Giraffe parenting styles. One thought that especially stuck with me was that Giraffe's long neck enables her to see wide and far, and therefore, consider many possibilities and perspectives. This is a very helpful stance for a parent to take, right?

On **Wednesday, March 13, from 9-10:30** am in our Community Room, we will have Sahar back to continue this conversation about using NVC tools in our parenting. We will explore what some children's common behaviours can indicate and how we peacefully handle these situations, even when we (and our kids) are tired and frustrated.

I often imagine the results if we all practiced this kind of behavior, and our children learned this kind of peaceful stance in their relationships with us, and amongst their friends.... What a different world we would have. I love this quote from Marshall Rosenberg:

"Peace requires something far more difficult than revenge or merely turning the other cheek; it requires empathizing with the fears and unmet needs that provide the impetus for people to attack each other. Being aware of these feelings and needs, people lose their desire to attack back because they can see the human ignorance leading to these attacks; instead, their goal becomes providing the empathic connection and education that will enable them to transcend their violence and engage in cooperative relationships."


Do you qualify?

To qualify you must live in Burnaby and meet the following criteria:

- You are a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or government or privately sponsored refugee.
- You meet the low-income criteria outlined on the application form below.
- You receive government income assistance.
- You are a Canadian Ukraine Authorization for Emergency Travel (CUAET) applicant.

The Recreation Credit application forms below provide more detail and list the supporting documents you'll need to include with your application. Completed applications are reviewed and approved by agencies listed on the forms.

Birth year is January to December; players may be 4 years of age when starting the season.

Family Rate - families with 3 or more players receive a \$100 refund.

All registrations include shorts, dryfit shirt, team photos, use of team jerseys, BCLA insurance, and free admission to Junior and Senior Laker games.

Refund Policy - Up to Jan 21, 2024, full refund less \$60 admin fee. Between Jan 21 at 11:59pm and April 1 at 11:59pm, 50% refund. After April 1st at 11:59pm, no refund.

Once players are placed on a team, a team fee will be required. The amount of the team fee will depend on costs of tournaments and other team activities.

- · Click on the REGISTRATION link
- · We accept credit card or e-transfer payments
- · If you pay by credit card, a 3% processing fee will be added
- · No cheques will be accepted

NEW PLAYERS

- · New players always pay the early bird fee
- · New players who register after January 21, 2024 e-transfer the lower rate
- New players who register after January 21, 2024 with a credit card, email the registrar for a \$40 refund

RETURNING PLAYERS

- · Please register on or before January 21, 2024 to receive the early bird rate
- · We accept credit card or e-transfer payments

THE SEASON

- · U7 and U9 season starts in early April, and runs until near the end of June
- U11 and above season starts late March, and runs until middle of July depending on playdowns and provinicials

PLAYER EVALUATIONS

- Evaluations for U11 and above divisions for A and B teams will commence in February 2024. Evaluations will not take place during spring break.
- Players must be registered and pay a \$40 fee when registering online to be evaluated. Full time goalies do not pay the evaluation fee.
